## Rotary Youth Leadership Awards



### Club Presidents and Youth Directors of Rotary District 9685,

I have the privilege this year to be your District Chair for the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards. RYLA is one of the most widespread and well recognised Rotary programs in Australia for young adults. RYLA is a great opportunity for young leaders to participate in an incredibly engaging and dynamic program run both by and for their peers.

The RYLA District Committee this year is made up of Rotarians from Ryde, St Ives and the Upper Northern Beaches.

One of the great achievements of the RYLA program is that it is organised and run by a team of young men and women known as Facilitators, under the leadership of their team leader: the RYLA Director. The Facilitators and Director are all previous graduates of the program, and are individually responsible for specific aspects of the RYLA program. It is an incredible tribute to the quality of the program that the leaders who come through the RYLA program each year are equipped and empowered to run the event themselves.

Rotary Clubs provide the direct point of contact for RYLA participants. Applicants are interviewed by members of their sponsoring Rotary Club prior to RYLA, and following the week-long seminar they will return to their sponsoring clubs as guest speakers to recount their valuable experiences. I personally encourage you to invite back your Awardees to further meetings, either as guests or indeed as prospective members of your Rotary Clubs.

Our goal is to achieve an attendance of 90 RYLA participants, all of whom will need Rotary Club sponsorship. I, along with the other members of the District Committee and Facilitator team, would welcome the opportunity to attend your Club to talk about this exciting event and fill in any further gaps regarding the RYLA experience.

## **Overview**

What is RYLA? RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award) is a transformational leadership program designed for young adults aged 18-27. Spanning over seven days, the program combines some of Australia's finest speakers with engaging activities and challenges, as well as a supportive environment that enables their leadership to grow and develop to its full potential. RYLA is run annually, with approximately 90 participants at Uniting Venues Conference Centre Elanora Heights.

Applicants must be at least 18 years and under 27 years of age at 1 January 2018, have left school for at least one year and be permanent residents of Australia residing in New South Wales. In addition, RYLA participants must be in attendance during the whole week; leaving the venue is not permitted.

Rotary Clubs or Employers or other organisations sponsor participants for the RYLA program. This includes board and lodging, guest speakers, and a range of indoor and outdoor activities.

This year, RYLA will be from Sunday 7th January to Saturday 13th January 2018. RYLarians (participants of the RYLA program) must be able to attend the entire week.

## **Responsibility of Rotary Clubs Before RYLA**

Rotary Clubs are requested to find one or more suitable applicants for RYLA and sponsor them to attend. Rotary Clubs are required to interview all applicants. A guideline for interview questions is provided in this document.

If a Rotary Club has more suitable applicants than they can sponsor, they are requested to prioritise them and put forward all eligible applications. The RYLA Committee will seek to match them with a sponsor Rotary Club until all places in the program are filled.

The Registrar may receive applications directly from applicants, through the online application form. The Registrar will contact a Rotary Club if an applicant within your area is seeking sponsorship. Please still make contact and interview them as this is part of the whole RYLA experience.

Rotary Clubs are requested to invite all sponsored applicant(s) to a Rotary Club meeting before RYLA, so they can familiarise themselves with the Club.

## **During RYLA**

Each sponsoring Rotary Club is expected to provide transport for the participant(s) to and from RYLA. RYLA participants cannot take their own vehicle nor leave the campsite.

Rotary Clubs are requested to send at least one or more members to support their sponsored participant(s) at a formal dinner, held on Tuesday 9th January 2018.

## **After RYLA**

Shortly after the finish of RYLA, Rotary Clubs are requested to invite back all sponsored participant(s) to their Rotary Club meeting, as the guest speaker(s). The RYLA participant(s) can spend this guest speaker time to talk about their RYLA experience.

Participants Applicants must be at least 18 years and under 27 years of age at 1 January 2018, have left school for at least one year and be permanent residents of Australia residing in New South Wales. In addition, RYLA participants must be in attendance during the whole week; leaving the venue is not permitted. It is desirable that applicants are involved in some form of local community leadership.

Preferably, RYLA participants are leaders from groups such as Scouts, Guides, church groups, sporting clubs, local business or emergency services such as Fire Brigade or St John Ambulance.

## **Cost**

The cost to sponsor a participant of RYLA this year is \$875.

Rotary Clubs sponsor participants for the RYLA award. It includes board and lodging, guest speakers, and a range of indoor and outdoor activities.

# What is autism?

Autism is a lifelong developmental condition that affects, among other things, the way an individual relates to his or her environment and their interaction with other people.

The main areas of difficulty are in social communication, social interaction and restricted or repetitive behaviours and interests.

Autism lasts a lifetime and affects about one in 100 Australians, or 230,000 people. The word 'spectrum' reflects the different challenges that people on the autism spectrum face and the degree to which they may be affected.

Aspect Central Coast School caters for 137 students across the Gosford and Wyong local council areas between the ages of 4 and 17. The school includes an administrative base at Terrigal which has early childhood and primary school classes, and a range of satellite classes located in Woy Woy, East Gosford, Wamberal, Tuggerah, Toukley and Lake Munmorah.

The school also provides primary and secondary educational services through satellite classes. These classes are made possible through our partnerships with the NSW Department of Education and Training and the Broken Bay Diocese Catholic Education Office.

**The services** provide people on the autism spectrum with the opportunity to realise their unique potential, as well as providing much needed support to their families, carers, friends and colleagues.

**The vision** is to provide the best possible opportunities for people on the spectrum.

Asperger's is now recognised as falling within the autism spectrum
